- I worked on a project fully funded by the National Science Foundation (NSA/RAPID) as the managing project assistant. It is a longitudinal panel study of a nationally representative sample of Syrian refugees in Europe. The survey is conducted on the Syrian refugees in more than 16 cities and in 7 different countries. The survey collected two waves of data on the same families through phone interviews, face-to-face interviews and online interviews. This study aims to answer many questions about the social and political integration of Syrian refugees in Europe including the change in their attitudes towards democracy, level of [successful] integration and show the challenges that Syrians and states experienced. We examine the various individual and contextual level factors that shape successful social and political integration. In this project, I managed the surveys on Qualtrics and analyzing the data from longitudinal panel survey using tools such as R and STATA. I did data harmonization and created a codebook for both of the waves for this project. I monitored the surveys on Qualtrics, generated and cleaned datasets using STATA. I am responsible for the coordination of a team of four. After finishing the data collection for the second wave, we used multilevel regression to analyze the findings.

- The project was a longitudinal survey conducted each year for three years and was a large dataset. We conducted face-to-face interviews with 3781 participants above 18 years old in a representative sample of 81 provinces of Turkey through a survey company that we hired. We created most of the survey questions (80 percent) from scratch. I was responsible for full-cycle survey research from design, data collection, analysis to presentation. I was the only managing project assistant in TUBITAK 1001-215K169 (Turkish Public Opinion) project between 2017-2019 which received the highest amount of public funding in social sciences. I had experience with the primary data collection as I conducted the pilot survey in several cities in Turkey and attended the meetings with the Poll survey companies. I used multi-level regression analysis, bivariate and multivariate ordinal logistic regressions. I communicated the results of the analysis and took part in writing the final report. I also had experience initiating and driving research projects to completion with minimal guidance as I was the managing research assistant of this project
